- FAI EDIC-approved list : To be eligible for the European Championship, AMRTs must be configured with **CAT 1 firmware**. Please ensure that your device is running the correct firmware version.

Junior.

According to CIAM General Rules Volume C.5.1, a competitor is considered to be a junior up to and including the calendar year in which they attain the age of 18. So, a competitor will be considered a Junior for this championship as long as they were born after 1st January 2008.

FAI Sporting Licence

Every competitor and each Team Manager of any national team must possess a valid FAI Sporting Licence (Aeromodelling discipline) registered in the FAI database. An FAI Sporting Licence is not required for the helpers.

The holder of an FAI Sporting Licence may be required to produce, as proof of identity, an official document including his/her names, photograph and signature.

Complaint and protest

The purpose of a complaint is to try to obtain a correction without the need to make a formal protest. It is recommended that a complaint be made before submitting a protest.

All protests must be presented by the team manager(s) in writing in English to the Contest Director and must be accompanied by the deposit of a fee of 50 CHF (or equivalent amount for a different currency).

Anti-doping statement

A competitor who needs for medical reasons to take any of the substances listed on the WADA Prohibited List must have a valid Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) signed by FAI.

Identification of the models

According to CIAM General Rules Volume C.11.1, each model aircraft shall carry :

- The national identification mark followed by the FAI Unique ID number with letters and numbers at least 25 mm high.

Model Aircraft Specification Certificate and sticker

According to the CIAM General Rules Volume C.12, each NAC shall process every model and shall issue for each model aircraft the Model Aircraft Specification Certificate Stamp by NAC. Each competitor must fill for each Model Specification Certificate document and the FAI sticker must be glued on each model for the model processing.

Every NAC may enter a team consisting of:

Senior Championship

- Team Manager.
- Assistant Team Manager (not mandatory).
- Maximum of three competitors
- One additional Female competitor (optional)
- Official helpers.
- Supporters.

The reigning Champion has the right (subject to the approval of their NAC) to participate in the class concerned. If they are not a member of their national team, they will not be considered for the national team classification.

Junior Championship

- Team Manager.
- Assistant Team Manager (not mandatory).
- Maximum of three junior competitors
- One additional Female junior competitor (optional)
- One additional individual Junior competitor (optional)
- Official helpers.
- Supporters.

The reigning Junior Champion has the right (subject to the approval of their NAC) to participate in the class concerned if still eligible as junior. If they are not a member of their national team, they will not be considered for the national team classification. When a reigning Junior Champion is no longer junior, they cannot be considered for the individual Junior classification.

Additional individual competitors

In accordance with CIAM General Rules, Volume C.5.3 f, a request was submitted to the CIAM Bureau to grant one Junior Wildcard per nation for the 2026 F5J European Championship. This request has been officially approved.

Consequently, subject to approval by their respective NAC, each nation is now authorised to register one additional Junior pilot. Registration shall be handled via the Final Entry Form.

CLASSIFICATIONS AND AWARDS

- FAI medals and FAI diplomas will be awarded to the senior competitors placed first, second and third.
- FAI medals and diplomas will be awarded to the first, second and third placed Juniors only if four (4) or more juniors are competing. If the number of Junior participants is less than this number (four), then only FAI diplomas will be awarded.
- All senior Females will compete for the overall Senior individual classification. Additionally, there is a Senior Female classification.
- All Junior Females will compete for the overall junior individual classification. Additionally, there is a Junior Female classification. FAI medals and diplomas will be awarded to the first, second and third placed Female Junior or Senior, only if four (4) or more females are competing. If the number of Female Junior or Senior participants is less than this number (four), then only FAI diplomas will be awarded.

In order to be awarded the title of European Junior Champion, a minimum of four Juniors from at least four nations must participate.

In order to award the title of Senior Female European Champion, a minimum of four Senior Female competitors from at least four nations must participate.

FLYING RESTRICTION

Training flights are permitted on the Airfield Thursday August 13th between 1:30 pm and 6:00 pm.

The competition will take place at Abbeville's aeroclub. So we must share the airfield with airplanes, according to the following table (may change).

By participating in the European Championship, competitors agree to strictly adhere to the flight ban periods specified by the organisers. Please find the Safety Notice attached, we ask all Team Managers, competitors and helpers to take the Safety Notice into account.

We understand the wishes of the pilots. We will offer each team a training session at our local airfield, located 31 km from the airfield of the European Championship. Weather conditions at both airfields are similar.

HANS KRAUSE TROPHY F5J (PRECONTEST)

We will follow the latest FAI rules. As the Hans KRAUSE Trophy is a secondary class event, motor restart is allowed. AMRTs could be set with CAT II firmware.

During the Pre-contest, there will also be an Open Day for the public. In order to prevent incidents, we ask all competitors to fly safely. Do not make high-speed circling over public areas such as the corridor, public parking, and town side of the airfield. If we estimate any dangerous situation, the contest director and his assistant will penalise the competitors.

Safety Area :

Landing in these areas will incur a 300-point penalty; if the model touches someone, the penalty will be 1000 points.

LODGING AND FOOD

LODGING :

The city of Abbeville offers a wide range of accommodation options. There are hotels and guesthouses where you can make reservations through booking sites. Accommodation should be booked at the beginning of the year, due to summer periods. CAMPING on the AIRFIELD :

Camping is available from 13/08/2026 at 11:30 am on-site with the following facilities :

- Water
- Toilets
- Electricity (extensions will not be provided to campers)
- Shower

Rules in the camping :

- Under the French Safety Regulations, we are not allowed to pitch motorhomes, tents or caravans together. So we will separate each type of pitch in the camping area.
- According to recommendations for events, in case of hot weather and if the land is dry, barbecues will be forbidden. In the case barbecues are allowed, we will dedicate a space for them with an extinguisher nearby.

For organizational purposes, all campers must be registered to have access to the campsite. The camping fee is 5€ per pitch. Camping on the airfield is permitted from Thursday August 13 to Sunday August 23, 2026.

FOOD :

- **Booking :** We do not take reservations for lunch, Nation Party or Gala Dinner after 1st August
- **Lunch :** A catering service will be available from Friday 14 August to Friday 21 August. Lunch will be a main course and a dessert, with water freely available. The food provided will allow diners to sample typical French food.
- **Dinner :**

AIRFIELD

Paddock

- Provided Equipment: One 4.5m x 4.5m Coleman Shelter per team (supplied by the organisers).
- Personal Equipment: Teams may set up a maximum of 2 or 3 of their own shelters directly behind the official one, according to the space left.
- Access & Logistics: The paddock is a pedestrian-only zone. You must have a personal badge; before accessing the paddock, make sure to collect your badge. To facilitate logistics, a dedicated shuttle service will run each morning and evening for equipment transport.
- Dining Area: A communal marquee will be available for lunch.
- On-site toilets, water access and electricity are available. We do not provide extensions. It's possible to have up to 20m to the terminal block. Additionally, electricity is limited to a maximum of 3A.
- Access conditions: Each person entering the paddock area must wear their nominative badge.

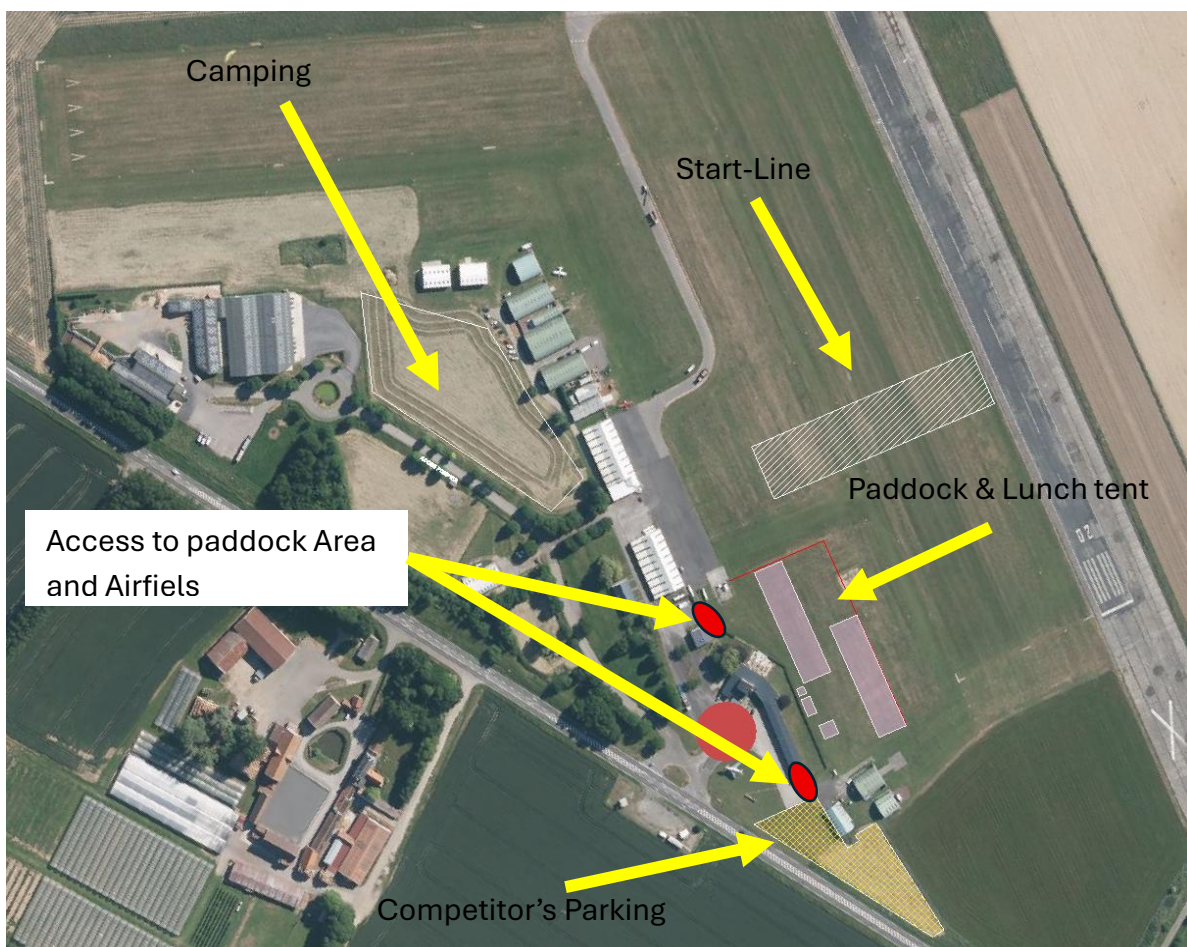


Figure 4 : Airfield Map

Training Airfield

During the forbidden flight period, we are pleased to offer European Championship pilots the opportunity to train at our local airfield. Located in Saint-Quentin-la-Motte-Croix-au-Bailly, the site is 31 km from Abbeville (50.0728586, 1.4724439).

Please note that for safety and capacity, we have tried to limit the number of pilots flying simultaneously. Based on each team's request for a training session, we have managed to offer at least one session per nation. Each nation will find below the training slot assigned to it. Our airfield is freely accessible to all competitors of the championship; the training slots are only intended to regulate the number of pilots flying at the same time. Throughout the whole period of the championship you are allowed to fly at the training airfield.

CLOSING CEREMONY AND BANQUET

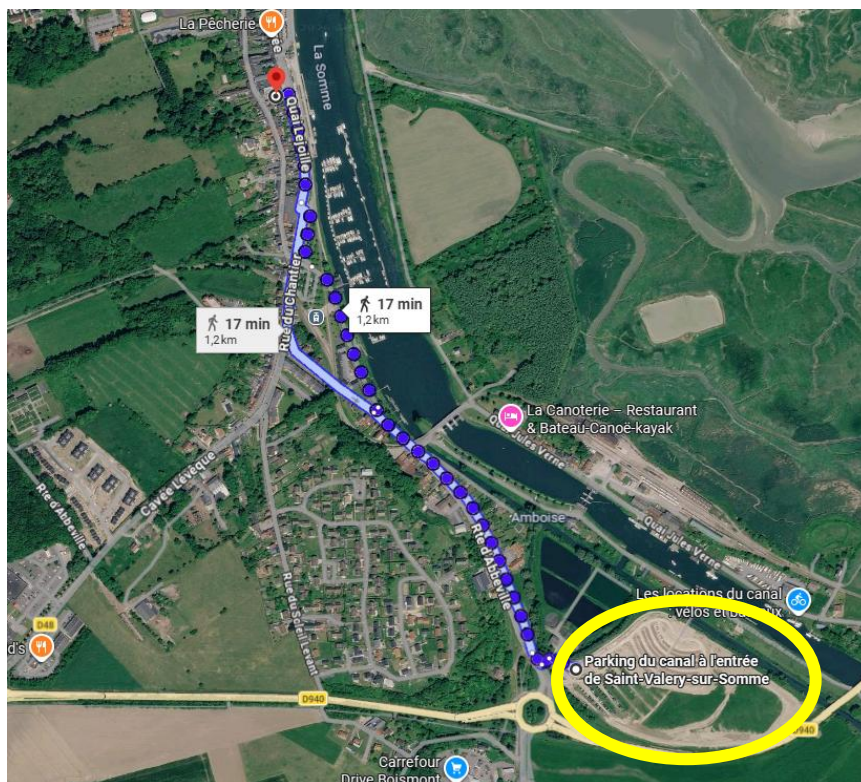


Figure 8 : Parking for Closing ceremony and Gala Diner

UAV REGULATION

UAV regulations must be respected for the Hans KRAUSE Trophy and the European Championship.

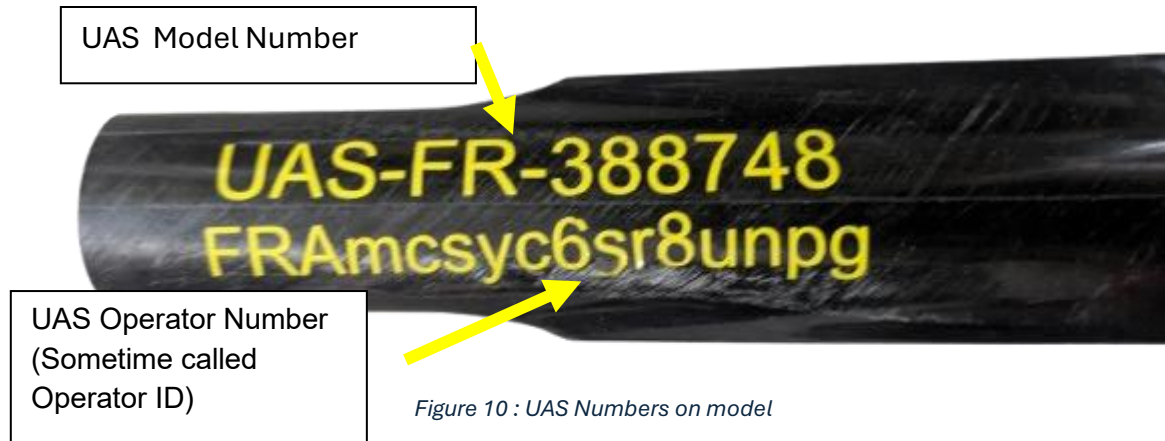
- ◆ UAS Operator Number (sometimes called Operator ID)
 - Must be visibly applied on all UAV models.
 - Number issued to you when you register as a UAS operator with the civil aviation authority of your country of residence (EU Regulation 2019/947, Art. 14). It is not the same as your A1/A3 remote pilot training certificate.
 - For juniors, apply the number of their referent or ask the organisers to provide a UAS Operator Number.
- ◆ UAS Model Registration Number
 - Under French national rules, every model aircraft weighing more than 800 grams must be registered by its owner. Competitors resident in another EU/EASA State register with their own national authority; competitors resident outside the EU whose first flight in Europe takes place in France must register on the AlphaTango website (<http://alphatango.aviation-civile.gouv.fr/login.jsp>)
 - The UAS model registration number must be applied visibly on the models. (We will check it during model processing)
 - For Juniors, their referent must declare their model if they are younger than 14 years old.

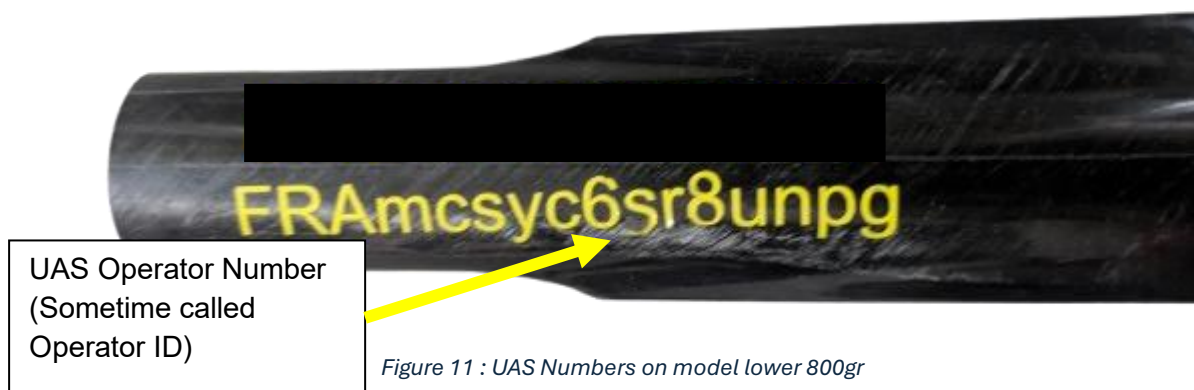
Figure 9 : Extract of the civil Unmanned Aircraft Register

♦ Alcohol Restriction

- Maximum blood alcohol concentration : 0.20 g/L
- OR maximum alcohol concentration in exhaled air : 0.10 mg/L

As the organiser, we reserve the right to deny any pilot or helper access to the flight corridor or permission to fly if the person exceeds the maximum blood alcohol concentration.

INSURANCE

The organiser will provide third party insurance for all participants during the competition for accidents involving injury to others and damage to property according to the host country's legislation.

Participants are recommended to organise their own individual health and travel insurance before travelling.

By registering for the European Championships or the Hans KRAUSE Trophy, all competitors explicitly acknowledge and grant permission for their image, likeness, and voice to be captured and used by the organisers across platforms such as social media, newspapers, and television.

For minor participants: In the absence of any written objection notification at the time of registration, it is strictly understood that both legal guardians have given their full consent for the use of the child's image as described above. Participation constitutes a formal agreement by the legal representatives to these terms.

VISA

Visitor visas are generally not required in France, but please inquire with the embassy or consular office in your country for application. The organiser will be able to help with recommendation letters should they be required.

FFAM

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French regulations apply to all aeromodelers and is therefore also applicable to competition organized on the French national territory.

As a foreign pilot, if you come and fly for leisure, please refer to guides available on FFAM website (<https://contenu-informatif.ffam.asso.fr/reglementation/>) for guest pilots.

The following information only applies for competition where FFAM will deliver to every pilot a competition passport that allow them to fly under the rules described below only during the time of the competition.



When you come to compete in France, you have obligations

- Be registered as UAS Operator
- Register each model over 800g on French National Aviation Authority website
- Follow briefing of the organizer that replace UAS training certificate
- Have an FFAM competition passport

1 - Being registered as UAS Operator

Whatever the weight of the model you are using and whatever the discipline you practiced is (radio, control line flying, free flight), according to UE regulation 947 article 16 authorization that FFAM had, you MUST be register as UAS Operator when you participate to a competition in France.

Some solution exists depending from which country you are coming from.

- If you belong to an European Union country, you can / must register directly on your country national system in order to obtain your UAS Operator number
- If you belong to a non-European Union country, you can register on the French Aviation Authority website (<https://alphatango.aviation-civile.gouv.fr>) to perform your registration for free and obtain your UAS Operator number
- If you only plan to fly during the competition, you will be entitled by the organizer to use FFAM UAS operator number.

Once you have an UAS Operation registration number, you must stick it on every of your model and being able to present in case of control the extract of UAS Operator register.

2 - Register each model over 800g on French National Aviation Authority website

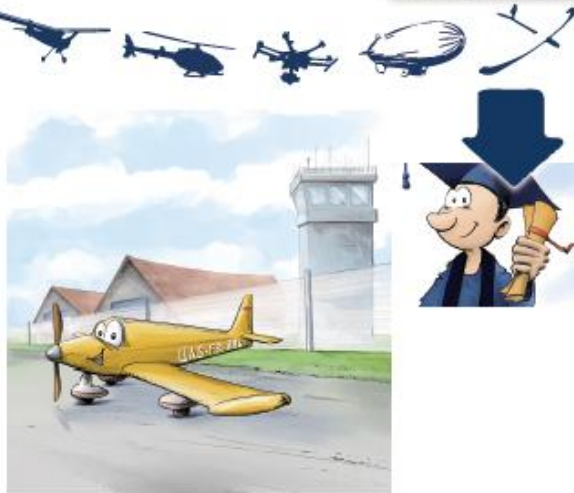
French regulation requires that any model over 800g has to be registered on the French Aviation Authority website (<https://alphanango.aviation-civile.gouv.fr>)



- Once registered, you will received a registration number and an registration extract In pdf format.
 - You must tag your model with the registration number that should be readable at 30cm.
 - You have to be able to present the registration extract In case of control.

Registration is free of charge.

3 - Follow briefing of organizer that replace UAS training certificate

As per the French regulation, all pilots over the age of 14 must have completed the training and be able to present a training certificate.

This does not apply during competition, where a briefing will be conducted which replaces the training.

During the briefing it will be specified exactly what you are allowed to do on the airfield.

If you want to fly in France before or after the competition or for leisure, you must have followed a official training either in your country for EU pilots or on the French Aviation Authority website (<https://alphanango.aviation-civile.gouv.fr>).



4 - Have an FFAM competition passport



All foreign pilots attending a competition organized by an affiliated club will get a FFAM competition passport which is valid only during the time of the competition event.

For pilots which do not have such a passport, it is mandatory to onboard a remote ID device on their model.

FFAM delivers the competition passport for free.

Pilots have to provide following information:

- gender
- last name
- first name
- address (street, city, country)
- date of birth
- email address

Pilots are invited to provide information as soon as possible in order that passport order being done by competition's organizer to FFAM before the competition.

Register your model on the DGAC web site Alphetango (free of charge) and apply registration number on to the model

- Create an account on Alphetango
- Register all your models over 800g you expect to use in France
- You receive a registration number for each one
- Put the registration number on each model clearly readable at 30cm
- Download a registration certificate

Safety Notice – Airspace Restrictions and Flying Schedule

2026 FAI F5J European Championship for Electric Powered Thermal
Duration Gliders – ABBEVILLE

1. Airspace Restrictions

The 2026 FAI F5J European Championship will be held at the Abbeville Aeroclub under a Temporary Segregated Area (TSA) established by the French Civil Aviation Authorities (DGAC) and coordinated by Lille Air Traffic Control.

The following restrictions apply throughout the competition, including the World Cup and training periods:

Daily Activation periods:

- Thursday 13th August from 14:00 to 18:30
- Friday 14th and Saturday 15th August from 08:30 to 18:30
- Sunday 16th August from 08:30 to 11:00
- Monday 17th to Friday 21st August from 08:30 to 18:30
- Saturday 22nd August from 8:30 to 13:00

When the TSA will be activated, the organizer will announce it, with audio and visual signal, to all competitors. No flights will be permitted before this announcement. Before deactivation organizer will ask all pilots to land and deactivation will be announced too, again with visual and audio signal.

Airspace:

A cylindrical area with a diameter of 3 km, centered on the flying site and extending from the surface up to 2,500 ft.

Restriction:

Manned aircraft are prohibited from entering this airspace while the TSA is active.

These restrictions have been implemented to ensure the safe coexistence of model aircraft operations and manned aviation.

The restrictions do not apply to the designated training fields.

2. Flying Schedule

All model aircraft operations must take place only during the authorized flying periods defined above.

No model aircraft may be flown before or after the daily activation periods under any circumstances, including practice flights, trimming, testing, or demonstration flights. Please note that the restrictions apply from the surface; therefore, even hand-launched test flights are prohibited.

Strict compliance with these operating hours is mandatory for all competitors, helpers, team members, officials, and World Cup participants.

Failure to comply may result in serious consequences, including:

- Investigation and legal action by the French Air Police.
- Immediate withdrawal of the airspace authorization by the French Civil Aviation Authorities, potentially leading to the suspension or cancellation of the championship.
- Creation of a significant safety hazard through potential conflict with manned aircraft operating outside the protected airspace.

3. Safety Responsibility

Safety is the responsibility of every participant.

Respecting the published flying schedule is essential to:

- protect manned aviation;
- protect all participants and spectators;
- maintain the authorization granted by the French Civil Aviation Authorities; and
- ensure the successful completion of the European Championship.

Given the critical importance of complying with the airspace restrictions, Team Managers and competitors will receive a comprehensive safety briefing before the start of the championship.

In accordance with the provisions of the FAI Sporting Code, the Contest Director and/or the Jury may impose penalties, up to and including the disqualification of an individual competitor or even an entire National Team from the event.

This Safety Notice is intended as a preventive and educational measure rather than a punitive one. Its purpose is to ensure that every participant fully understands the importance of complying with the airspace restrictions, thereby protecting the safety of all airspace users while safeguarding the successful completion of the championship.

The Organizer thanks all competitors, Team Managers, helpers, officials, Jury members, and volunteers for their cooperation and commitment to maintaining the highest standards of safety.
